Rare Earths Supply Technology and Resources Transformation Act of 2010

- Introduced by Mike Coffman (R-CO)
- 19 cosponsors
- Died in committee



Rare Earths Supply Technology and Resources Transformation Act of 2010

- Introduced by Sen. Murkowski (R-Alaska)
- 5 cosponsors (all Republicans)
- Died in committee



Rare Earths Supply-Chain Technology and Resources Transformation Act of 2010

- Introduced by Sen. Bayh and Bond (both retired)
- Dead on arrival



Rare Earths and Critical Materials Revitalization Act

- Introduced by Rep. Kathy Dahlkemper (D-PA)
- 6 cosponsors
- Passed in the 111th Congress by 325-98 vote
- Did not become law
- Reintroduced in the 112th by Rep. Leonard Boswell (D-Iowa)
- No cosponsors
- Currently in the Science Committee
